## **Full-Time Paid Summer** Internships for Undergraduates in Health Services Research

SUMR, a twelve-week summer internship introduces promising undergraduates to health services research. The program aims at creating and promoting equal opportunities for students to conduct research in such fields as health economics, health care management, health policy, population health, and clinical epidemiology.
